

## Action Items on the Agenda:

Update:02-11-2018

I was able to attend this meeting, however I was not prepared like I would like to have been. The letter did not get created until after the meeting. However, I did meet with Representative Dawn Keefer, and when it was my turn to speak, I rambled on way to much on too many topics in what felt like fifteen minutes. I believe she was tired of my rant after a few minutes, especially when I breached the subject of Abolishing Abortion. And she had no knowledge of the Doctrine of the lesser Magistrate. I left her with a pamphlet that briefly describes the Doctrine. I have since written a one page letter that tried to stay within a few topics.

1. My response to a legislative effort to reduce spending by reducing the number of representatives to the districts in the State,
2. Essential Government Functions,
3. Abolish Abortion.

Greetings,

First I must take a moment to apologize for unloading too much talk on the night of the open house, January 18, 2018. I don't often get the opportunity to express my knowledge and concerns, and when I do, it all spills out in a few brief moments, and actually does no one any good.

Second, I had wanted to let you know that I did not vote for you. I believe that if you want my vote, someone should be knocking on my door and introducing themselves and describe how they intend to work to represent myself and my community. No one has done that since I have been living here. I just get some stupid flier in the mail just before the votes are cast. In addition, I really take exception to being reduced from a citizen to a slave with the label "taxpayer". So with all that being said, I would like to share a few brief points with you.

- 1) I received the recent email distribution that describes an attempt to reduce government waste by eliminating representative positions. I have to disagree with this approach. It appears to be counterproductive to the idea of adequate representation by eliminating the peoples “so called voice”. It appears to be just another move by the status quo to maintain their power base. A better way to reduce government waste is to eliminate the full time legislative sessions here in Pennsylvania. Most States legislative bodies perform their functions in a few months.
- 2) Within the wording of the States Constitution, I would define the words “Essential Government Functions” very narrowly. If one were to look at the government jobs board you will find an unreasonable amount of positions. I do not believe it is the function of government to create a mountain of bureaucracy to substantiate and justify creating endless positions that compete with and over regulate the private sector.
- 3) The State does not have a revenue problem, it has a spending problem.
- 4) If one really wanted to work to make real change and reduce government waste, those three principles stated above would be the right approach. Anything else is just an illusion.
- 5) I had attempted to speak about the deception of abortion. I have taken to the time to review legislative bills of a few of the Pennsylvanian's that call themselves Pro-Life. I find it disgusting how they bow down to the federal government in their Bill writing endeavors. You can not micro manage murder. All this nonsense could be easily disposed of simply if the State abolished the practice of legalized murder of the pre-born. Hiding behind an opinion of politically appointed (UN-elected) activist judges to a supreme court is a convenient way to ignore the truth.

I thank you for your time and attention you have taken to review my thoughts, observations, and research.

The following two page letter is my response to a candidate that attached an advertisement to my house door. He is running in the 2018 republican primary for State Representative in the 92<sup>nd</sup> district in Pennsylvania. So, You have an eye on the 92<sup>nd</sup>. District representative seat.

My name is Stephen Simmons and someone in your team left an advertisement on my door. Unfortunately I was not home so I did not get an opportunity to speak with the individual. Since I was not home I do not know the intent of the visit. Had they planned on speaking with me, or just hanging advertisements?

I have recently introduced myself and my writings to Representative Dawn Keefer. I had several things to say, but first and foremost I told her I was not happy with losing my status as a citizen of the State, and being reduced to a mere slave, A taxpayer. That was her pitch in the last election. I also told her I refused to vote for her because of that label applied to me. I understand she is very busy, and yesterday I was impressed with her speaking abilities in a recent interview on the Ken Mathews show, WHP 580 am. However, I am quick to realize that she is telling me something I already know. She is just going over it in detail. The State bureaucracy is large, UN-manageable, and leadership within the agencies are manipulating budgetary funds in UN-ethical ways. There is mass corruption at every level. I already know this. The question is, what are we doing about it. Meetings and questioning investigations only ever seem to produce reams of paper, and when the attention of the media is on to some other shock feature, business returns to normal and nothing is done about the problem. Everyone is talking the problems to death and not doing anything about it.

I believe the days of finding a comfortable place within the bureaucracy and reporting on the abuses and wasteful spending of money confiscated from hard working individuals, “under the taxation label” must come to an end. Enough is enough. We the people no longer have a say in government. The corporations and the lobbyists have more weight. Our voice is no longer heard. The representative republic is failing because it has evolved into a political nightmare that is for sale to the corporation. Its a nightmare because government is using the legal system and public safety agencies as enforcement mechanisms to fulfill the terms of the contract.

Now I have developed a set of criteria that I would expect from someone that is serious about becoming a representative of the people:

Recognize that the State does not have a revenue problem, it has a spending problem.

- 1) A representative must have a real thorough knowledge of history. Primarily Pennsylvania history, but also how that history intertwines with national and first nations history.
- 2) Talking points that originate around the current “buzz words” do not work for me.
- 3) Once in office, getting sucked into the distraction of arguing about money, tracking of money, spending of money, looking for money wrongfully used, is a distraction from the responsibilities. I have spoken with Scott Perry and he is doing the same thing at the Federal level, he has elaborated on this in town hall meetings.
- 4) If you are a Christian politician, then say so. Your text indicates you believe in the foundational directives issued by God for protecting life, strong families, opposing sinful activities, and being responsible. Just so you know, the State is actively working against those guiding principles. So how do you propose to work within a despotic system and restore those core directives? The truth of it is, any law that is made contrary to the law of God is no law at all.

I have a couple of suggestions, that if implemented, would go along way to accomplishing the goals you aspire too:

1. Eliminate full time legislative activities. Limit the legislature sessions to four months . Reducing the number of representation for the 5<sup>th</sup> most populous State strikes me as unconstitutional and irrational.

2. Define the broad and general statement within the State Constitution “essential government functions”. That is a partial statement of the actual text, but it is enough to make my point. The statement is wide open to interpretation. The number of government positions that are filled and UN-filled is staggering.
3. Eliminate the public employees union.

Enough said on all that, however I will make myself clear on one more point.

Protecting the Pre-born is simple. **We need to abolish the practice of abortion.** Micro managing the slaughter of children through the legislative process and then crying about the killings at the schools is hypocritical, irrational, unjust and represents an extreme failure on the part of law makers. **Defy the federal judiciary.** They do not make law, legislators do. Congress makes law. Not an unelected politically appointed lawyer. It is a disgrace that we have allowed the will of 5-7 individuals override the will of millions of Americans. We have allowed the founding principles of America, the US constitution, and the declaration of independence to become nothing more than platitudes.

The abolition of slavery was not accomplished by waiting on the federal system to make things right. Abolition was accomplished by defying the federal courts and congress's immoral and unjust federal law. It would be your responsibility to enforce the doctrine of the lesser magistrate and defy the tyrants that are creating and implementing immoral and unjust laws.

That is what I would expect from a representative of the people. I know that in today's selfish and ignorant attitudes of the people and the leadership thereof, these are not popular ideas. But these are ideas and concepts that must be explored. We must redirect the society back to a moral foundation. If we continue to allow anti-American institutions like the ACLU, as just one example, to continue on its unabated quest to destroy American freedoms, well then, you connect the dots.....

”the writing is on the wall”.

One more point. I have visited my representative office and asked these questions. They did not know the answers except to the first question.

1. *Why was there an underground railroad?* That answer is a little obvious, it was a support and transportation method used to assist people escaping bondage.
2. *Where was the underground railroad and where did it terminate?* The routes took many paths, but quite a few of them came through Maryland and into this area, Dillsburg, Dover, York Springs, and on up through Wilkes Barre, Scranton, and then off to New York.
3. *Why did these routes not terminate in Pennsylvania?* Because Slavery was legal Pennsylvania and the Federal Fugitive Slave Act was enforced in Pennsylvania.
4. *So where then did the railroad terminate?* The answer is Canada, because slavery was legal in all the United States of America. An examination of the laws that were enforced within the State of Pennsylvania are extremely eye opening. Like I said, you should know your history.

The mainstream has conditioned us to believe that this was a vile institution that only existed in the Southern States. Nothing could be farther from the truth.
